


2014-15 KIPP SAN JOSE COLLEGIATE SCHOOL PROFILE





ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) EXAMS: HIGH SCHOOL


KIPP Bay Area Schools students have high AP exam participation and success rates.

AP PARTICIPATION



92% of KIPP Bay Area Schools graduating seniors took at least one AP exam, compared to 41% across the state.

AP SUCCESS



76% of KIPP Bay Area Schools graduating seniors scored a 3 or higher on at least one AP exam, compared to 27% across the state.


ALL OF OUR STUDENTS COMMIT TO:

KIPP THROUGH COLLEGE

KIPP Through College ensures that all students and alumni have the skills and resources they need to navigate to and through college into self-sufficient adulthood. Services include: one-on-one college advising for eleventh and twelfth graders; alumni advising for KIPPsters in college; and career readiness coaching.

COLLEGE MATRICULATION



FOUR-YEAR COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

Of the first two graduating classes at KIPP San Jose Collegiate, 90 percent were admitted to at least one four-year college or university. Overall, 75 percent are matriculating or have matriculated to a four-year college or university, and 25 percent will enroll at a two-year college. In the San Francisco Bay Area, seven KIPP middle schools and three KIPP high schools are closing the achievement gap between low-income students and their more advantaged peers. These public charter schools are located in underserved neighborhoods of San Francisco, San Jose, San Lorenzo, and Oakland. Of the 3,200 students that KIPP Bay Area Schools serves, 95 percent are students of color and 77 percent are low-income.
