### 2013-14 SCHOOL PROFILE

KIPP Bayview Academy is a tuition-free, college-preparatory, public middle school located in the Bayview Hunters Point neighborhood of San Francisco. Since KIPP Bayview Academy opened its doors in 2003, it has consistently proven that with hard work and commitment, traditionally underserved students can achieve outstanding success.

In the San Francisco Bay Area, five KIPP middle schools and three KIPP high schools are closing the achievement gap between low-income students and their more advantaged peers. These public charter schools are located in underserved neighborhoods of San Francisco, East San Jose, San Lorenzo, and West Oakland. Of the 2,800 students that KIPP Bay Area Schools serves, 97 percent are students of color and 76 percent are low-income.




#### 2013 ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE INDEX (API)

The API gives all public schools in California a score from 200-1,000 based on their achievement on the California Standards Test.

KIPP Bayview Academy's API score is **839**, far above the state goal of 800, the state average of 790, and the state's average for low-income students of 743. KIPP Bayview students prove it is possible to close the achievement gap.

#### 2013 CALIFORNIA STANDARDS TEST (CST)

The California Standards Tests are subject-specific exams administered to public school students in second through eleventh grade every year. The chart below shows KIPP Bayview Academy's eighth grade (the school's oldest students) performance relative to the district and the state.



#### KIPP ACROSS THE NATION

KIPP, the Knowledge is Power Program, began in 1994 in Houston, Texas. Today, there are 141 KIPP schools in 20 states and Washington, D.C. serving 50,000 students. These free, open-enrollment, college-preparatory public schools in under-resourced communities help students develop the knowledge, skills, and character needed to succeed in college and the competitive world beyond.

*KIPP Bayview Academy is a California Distinguished School and a two-time winner of the Title I Academic Achievement Award, given to the top two percent of the 6,000 schools in the state serving a significant number of low-income students.*

## KIPP THROUGH COLLEGE

KIPP Through College ensures that all students and alumni have the skills and resources they need to navigate to and through college into self-sufficient adulthood. Services include: high school transition support for eighth graders; one-on-one college advising for eleventh and twelfth graders; alumni advising for KIPPsters in college; and career readiness coaching.



- Attend school each day from 7:55 AM to 4:15 PM, except Wednesdays (early release at 2:45 PM)
- Complete an average of two hours of homework each night
- Attend mandatory summer school
- Participate in after school and Saturday tutoring sessions

## CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT

Since KIPP's origins, our model has emphasized both academic rigor and the development of character strengths among our students. This year the national KIPP network is deepening its character work and focusing on integrating seven research-based strengths into the fabric of our curriculum and culture: grit, self-control, zest, social intelligence, gratitude, optimism, and curiosity.

From the first day of summer school, our students apply the KIPP Bayview Academy values (excellence, integrity, initiative, positivity, responsibility, and tenacity) to their daily routine.
